...council resolution

On December 5, 2011 Mississippi Mills Town Council approved Resolution 540-11, which stated that Phase 1 to 5 of the Augusta Street Park Rehabilitation Concept Plan be approved. The resolution further approved \$5,000 for the project to be included in the 2012 Town Council budget Phases 2 to 5 require final approval once plans are finalized and funds are raised, although phase 1 was given approval to proceed.





- the women who worked hard to get water and sewer services to this neighbourhood
- the community development work done after the fire that helped build a better Almonte

What it is and what it's not.

- It's not large
- It' small
- It's efficient
 - A summer water service exists in the park
 - The feature can be programable
 - Easily prepared for winter
 - Waste water can gravity feed to water the Neighbourhood Tomato Community Garden
 - age-friendly misting station so all ages during heat waves
 - and importantly a memorial to the four children who perished in a fire in 1965 due to the lack of water in this neighbourhood
 - Some fundraising has already happened. Friends of Augusta has a bank account with a small amount of money. Some money was set aside at the town.

We ask the town to budget for the completion of phase 5 of the Augusta Street Park Plan, an intergenerational, memorial, water feature.


