## THE CORPORATION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF MISSISSIPPI MILLS

## **BY-LAW NO. 24-037**

**BEING** a by-law to amend Delegate of Authority By-law 13-18, as amended.

**WHEREAS**, Section 5 (3) of the Municipal Act 2001 S.O. Chapter 25 as amended states that the powers of a municipality shall be exercised by by-law;

**AND WHEREAS**, Section 23.1 of the Municipal Act 2001 S.O. Chapter 25 authorizes a municipality to delegate its powers and duties to a person;

**AND WHEREAS** it is deemed expedient to delegate authority to staff;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Mississippi Mills enacts as follows:

- 1. To add in the following:
  - C.21 The Director of Roads and Public Works is hereby granted authority to cause a stop sign to be temporarily erected at their discretion for the purposes of public safety. This temporary stop sign shall be considered to be enacted under section 11 of the Municipal Act 2001, which authorizes municipalities to enact by-laws respecting matters within the sphere of jurisdiction of "highways, including parking and traffic on highways," in conjunction with the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act.

It is also mandated that the temporary stop sign shall require the Director to publish a notice for the temporary installation on the Municipal Website, including location, effective date, and expiration date.

It is further understood that the penalties provided in section 214 of The Highway Traffic Act shall apply to offenses against this installation. This authorization is effective immediately upon issuance and shall remain in force until revoked or amended by the appropriate authority.

- 2. **THAT** this By-law will come into effect on the day of its passing.
- 3. **THAT** By-law 13-18 shall be and is hereby amended.

**BY-LAW READ** passed, signed, and sealed in open Council this 18th day of June 2024.

C.22 The Director of Roads and Public Works is hereby granted authority to mandate the temporary conversion of a road from one-way traffic to two-way traffic or from two-way traffic to one-way traffic for the purposes of public safety.

Furthermore, the Director must publish a notice on the Municipal Website specifying the location of the temporary conversion, its effective date, and its expiration date. This notice should be made available to the public prior to the implementation of the temporary conversion.

In all cases, appropriate traffic signs shall be installed for the duration of the temporary conversion to ensure clear and safe navigation for motorists and pedestrians.

This authorization is effective immediately upon issuance and shall remain in force until revoked or amended by the appropriate authority.
