


Ginawaydaganuc Village: Governance, Funding, and Future Development




Formation of Ginawaydaganuc Village

Grandfather William's Vision


- This project is dedicated to globally renowned Algonquin Elder and visionary leader Grandfather William Commanda.

We want to plant the seeds for the next seven generations!


Meaning of Ginawaydaganuc Village

"Ginawaydaganuc" translates to "We/All are connected," reflecting the Village's vision of interconnectedness. The Village promotes sustainable relationships, inclusive communities, and collaborative efforts to enhance the planet's well-being.





- Ginawaydaganuc Village is registered as a non-profit under the name 14158407 Canada Centre. We are in the process of applying for charity status.
- The overarching mission focuses on cultural preservation, education, environmental stewardship and healing.
- The non-profit is the central hub that governs the Elder's Lodge and the educational centre, known as the Academy.
- Other businesses and services in the Village will have a symbiotic relationship with the central hub.
