DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS:

We hosted a very successful Community Open House (61 Booths) and a Community Organization Luncheon on funding that was well attended and well received. We hosted 3 family movie events this quarter and partnered with the youth center, on the canteen.

New this year we generated some revenue through March Break by promotion sponsorship opportunities for public skating.

We received news of two successful grant applications the first towards the salary for a Tourism summer student and \$15,000 for Canada Week Celebrations, which includes Indigenous Peoples Day (June 21st) Canadian Multi Cultural Day (June 27th) and Canada Day (July 1st).

2025 PROJECT UPDATES/PENDING ITEMS:

This quarter staff invested significant time in our Economic Development Plan background data collection and analysis to prepare for the May PIC. In preparation of the themes and data was reviewed our Mississippi Mills Business Survey, the 2025 Statistics Canada's Labour Market Data, the 2021 Census, and Statistics Canada Agricultural Data Next steps will be the stakeholder sessions and preparations for the June PIC.

Work is progressing on the new Mississippi Mills Inclusion Charter and Welcome Package—important tools designed to foster a welcoming, inclusive, and equitable environment for everyone who lives in, works in, moves to, or visits our community. These initiatives aim to celebrate diversity, promote belonging, and ensure that all individuals feel respected, valued, and supported as part of the Mississippi Mills family.

We participated in the Ottawa Travel Show in March and distributed our new 2025 Mississippi Mills Visitor Guide this year's guide is a pocket size and links back to the website for more information. We printed 7000 guides that will be distributed across the region over the summer months.
